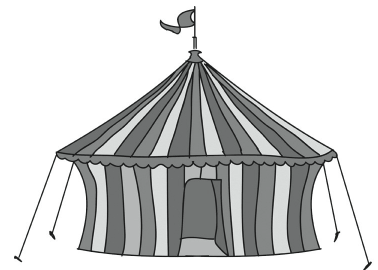

Campground Superintendents: Fred Frye - All campers must enter through Gate 2, Campsites are on a first come first serve basis, \$20.00 per day which includes 15-amp electrical hookup and water. All campers must have a back flow valve. Payment made when you enter the fairgrounds along with your daily entrance fees for all in your party through Sunday. If you choose to leave early a refund will be given at the time that you leave. Campers will be billed for every night that they are on the grounds, whether they are hooked up or not.
